Hoshino Toshiya (Japan)

Professor Ambassador Hoshino Toshiya, PhD. is an internationally recognized scholar and practitioner in the fields of international public policy, with special in the United Nations multilateral diplomacy, administrative, expertise socio-economic and budgetary affairs, and has had a mix of mutually enhancing academic, executive and diplomatic career, including his appointment as Ambassador and Deputy Permanent Representative of Japan to the United Nations in New York, from 2017-2020, responsible for the Fifth Committed of the General Assembly among others, a co-chair of the ECOSOC-mandated Third annual Multi-stakeholder Forum on Science, Technology and Innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals (2018), and a senior representative of Japan to the Executive Boards of UNICEF as well as UNDP/UNFPA/UNOPS. He had previously served as Minister-Counsellor from 2006–2008 at the same mission in charge of political affairs and as a principal advisor to the Chair of the UN Peacebuilding Commission, and earlier in his career, was Special Assistant for Political Affairs at The Embassy of Japan, Washington, D.C., from 1988–1991.

Dr. Hoshino is currently a Professor and the founding Director of the Environmental, Social, and Governance Integration Research and Education Center (ESG-IREC) at Osaka University's Osaka School of International Public Policy (OSIPP). His additional current responsibilities include Executive Director at the Japan Foundation Kansai Center, Advisory Board Member of UNITAR, Adjunct Professor of Kyung Hee University, Republic of Korea, Board Member of the United Nations Association of Japan, President of the International Academic Forum, Executive Director of the Global Classroom Japan Council.

Previous to his second secondment to the Japanese Mission to the UN in 2017, Dr. Hoshino held a number of senior administrative roles in the University, including Vice-President (2014–2015) and then Executive Vice-President (2015–2016) for Global Engagement, having previously served as Dean of the Osaka School of International Public Policy at Osaka University from 2011–2014.

Before joining Osaka University in 1998, Ambassador Hoshino was a Senior Research Fellow at The Japan Institute of International Affairs (JIIA) from 1991 to 1998, and continued his association with the Institute as an Adjunct Fellow from 1998 to 2006. He holds a BA from Sophia University, Japan, an MA from the University of Tokyo, and a PhD from Osaka University.

Dr. Hoshino has also been a visiting academic staff at The Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs, Princeton University (1992–1993); at Wollongong University, Australia (2000); at the Hiroshima Peace Institute, Hiroshima City University (2000–2002); at the Stanford Japan Center, Kyoto, Stanford University (2003–2006); and at the School of International and Public Affairs at Columbia University (2006–2007). Dr. Hoshino was a visiting professor at Inner-Mongolia University, People's Republic of China, from 2010 to 2015 as well as a Vice President of EU Institute Japan-Kansai, Japan from 2009 to 2011.
